Policy 713, SOGI – Statement was made by the ASDW DEC "The Chairperson remarked that the DEC notes the considerable conversations in the media regarding a review of EECD Policy 713 and wishes to state that the Council unequivocally supports the policy as it is currently written and considers any review of the policy should be focused on making it stronger and not reducing the safeguards within the policy." Subsequently, we have been requested by the media, if we were going to follow suit with the other school districts in creating our own new Policy 713. PSSC Principal's Report Carleton North High School

September 27th, 2023

Facilities Updates-

- a. Completion of electrical upgrade occurred this summer and the transformer is located outside the school with all previous transformers removed. This started 15 months ago and was on hold for parts. Part of our Mid-Life upgrade.
- b. Paving: More than half the school drive is paved with addition of two side-walk areas put in. The remainder should be scheduled for next year. This is part of the mid-life upgrades to the school.
- c. Hard Court: Nearly complete. Paving, order of equipment done and the remainder is installation. We will have tennis, pickleball, basketball and ball hockey with a couple other items painted for fun. Two entrance/exits now installed. Came in on budget thanks to RDC, McCain Foundation as well as donations form District of Carleton North and our own school contributions. Essentially, we have it done for about \$ 110,000.00.
- d. New Garage door for Woodshop: ASD-W facilities Manager Mark Reid believes all need to be replaced and he is looking at seeing if this can occur this year.
- e. Roof Leaks: two that we know of, one in the D-hall where new roof is and one over the staff room. ASD-W is on this too.
- f. Jason has asked district staff what else is in the scope of the mid-life upgrade so we are aware of what is coming this year/next year. We know our Theatre is not within the scope of the project and anything done to this will be up to the community.

2. Staffing Updates-

- New Teaching staff: Sarah Davenport (nee Sullivan), Jewel McLatchy (nee Frenette), and Kaylee Cronkhite.
- b. New EA's: Brenda Alward (Nackawic), Tara Guest (nee Richards), Brigit, Rachelle Williams. We have some substitutes in daily as our positions have been advertised in CUPE several times. This creates a rolling cascade of people taking permanent and casual positions. This should settle after October 15th. We had 7 positions advertised this year.

3. Grade 9-12 with High School Renewal:

- Students in 9 will operate much like MS in terms of core subject matter. Some new courses have been introduced such as wellness verses Personal and career development.
- b. Grades 10-12 have new courses, new curriculum framework where it is being called a holistic curriculum with social justice, human rights themes and other 21st century themes interwoven. Staff have had an introduction to this framework on their PL days and will continue to do so throughout the year. Students have started accumulating credits for graduation in grade 10 and will take a minimum of 120 credit hours of content across the curriculum areas (mandated and choice categories). They must achieve 100 credit hours of course work to graduate. Those on the older system will still have the same number of required courses but their credit hours have switched over in power school. Essentially, each course is now worth 4 credits hours. The department is working on micro-courses that could be worth 1, 2,3 or 4 credit hours and this will add to student ability to add credits regardless of their situation down the road. This is our first year with the changes and we believe things are looking good so far. As we encounter the

next year or two of change processes we will have issues to navigate especially with scheduling. Some flexibility is in the required courses for English. In the past, 7 credits were needed across four years (both semesters of English 9-11 with no flexibility). Now other courses can satisfy the literacy components and only one course labeled as English (9-12) is needed. Writing, journalism for example can satisfy literacy outcomes and this allows students greater flexibility as does it us in the scheduling process.

- 4. Referral Process for School Staff and Student Services Team:
 - a. A new electronic process will be in place through power school. Staff will need to submit their requests to school based ESS (Guidance, Resource & Admin) and this will be tracked with all related data, no more paper copies and should save time in the end.
 - b. ESS members will have to look for referrals intentionally as the system will not notify us (draw back). Anything we do, also tracked electronically and this is supposed to expedite service requests from district ESS team. I suspect we will still have to tell them when we've sent a request for service request so they will know to look.
- 5. Potato Harvest Enhancement Agreement:
 - a. We are still supporting our students to the best of our ability to participate in Harvest.
 - b. There was a complaint to our MLA's office that we were not supporting this anymore and I was questioned about this.
 - c. When the last agreement was signed, a policy was written for ASD-W called "Ends-Policy" which means that the formal policy, technology supports, and planning around this had an end date. I have inquired as to the status/copies of the policy so that the community is aware and we don't receive complaints.

PSSC Student Council Report

- We are organizing a Homecoming Dance for the 19th of October. This will be a formal dance, and we are planning on hiring a DJ (Alden Ebbet for \$270).
- 2. We are still looking for Teacher volunteers to supervise the dance so far, we have about 3.
- Our plan for theme days this year is to have a couple every month on Thursdays- the next one
 might be Tropical Thursday on October 5th. We are also planning on doing a couple of theme
 weeks before big breaks like Winter break and March break.
- 4. We have a new idea for a fundraiser this year- an outdoor movie. Entry will be free, and we will sell snacks. The location for the screen to be set up is still undecided. The date for this event is also TBD.
- 5. We are selling SPC cards for \$10, half of the money goes back to the suppliers, we get to keep the other half.

Baseball- We've had a couple of wins, season is almost over.

Soccer- Girls and boy's teams have been on winning streaks, The girls' team recently went to a tournament last weekend.

Hockey- Try-outs for Girls and Boys hockey have taken place.

Golf- The golf season is coming to an end- the team is heading off to PTA for regionals soon.

Basketball- Open gyms are happening for both teams, try-outs have not commenced yet.

Cheer- practices every Tuesday and Thursday, unsure of any upcoming meets.

Club Badminton- practices on Wednesday.

Swim Team- Run by Mr. Muise, practices on Sunday.
