Principal's Report:

Facilities:

- Mark Reid was into the school this week to examine the scope of work required to replace some windows in the C/D wing of the school. A contractor and DTI representative accompanied. No contract has been tendered as of yet. This should be forthcoming very soon.
- The cleaning contract expires in October this year. The contract will be available for tender later this spring/summer. I requested that district send staff to assess space and level of cleanliness two weeks ago. They sent two staff who evaluated our space, however, a report has not been sent to me as of yet. I have had several meetings with the existing custodial staff about deficiencies and expectations.

School Improvement Planning for 25-26:

- ✓ November 2024 School Improvement Framework Day for PL occurred provincially. A school report was generated using the provincial document and framework. This report was generated in Forms and submitted. It was an update on where our school plan was headed this year and what domains have been our focus.
- ✓ School Based PL Days throughout the year had dedicated analysis of data, discussion with all school staff.
- √ February Leadership Team Meeting: School Improvement Focus (ASD-W funded)
 - See document sent to PSSC, generated by committee as a report back to staff as to where we are in data analysis and process at this time for next year.
 - District Lead supported and Director of Schools stopped by during our process.
- ✓ April 29th Leadership Meeting: Continuation of data work
 - If you would like to attend, please feel free. We will be working on this from 12:00 noon until 5:00 pm.
- ✓ We will be soliciting feedback from PSSC throughout June as well as students in survey format and a session where we pull students together in a forum in May.

Staffing:

- We only have one new staff member this semester, which is Anna Galipeau who is replacing Mollie Antworth who is on Maternity Leave.
- Next year, we will need the following positions in our school:
 - 2 Math/Science Teachers
 - o 1 Technology/Business/Skilled Trades oriented teacher
 - o 1-2 Literacy/Humanities Teachers (FTE to determine this)

Updates:

 Student Recognition: The wall is under construction. We are trying to determine whether or not we add a feature similar to our sign underneath the stairwell. If we proceed in this direction, I would like to ask for further financial support from PSSC.

- CNC Plasma Cutter: Completion of setup and training to occur next week. Ken Robins will
 work with the company representatives to ensure he can run the tool and program
 associated. We hope to have projects completed in May and June from this new feature in
 our skilled Trades program.
- 3. Potential Pilot for School Calendar: There is an opportunity to apply to be part of a new model of PL and planned time for professional learning in a different format next year. I have expressed interest in this as a school who may be willing. Should I be asked to participate in the next round, I will pull a group together to evaluate out potential.
- 4. We are continuing to work through our scheduling process. We do not have FTE numbers for next year at this point in time. We do anticipate a decrease in enrollment; therefore, a decrease in total FTE for the school.
- 5. Staff evaluations are underway and they are due at the end of May.
- 6. We will be hosting the annual Student Turn-around award here at CNHS on the 21st of Wednesday. Would any of you like to attend? It is a lovely event and celebration of our youth from our feeder schools.

School-Wide:

- Mr. Robins' Maintenance Auto class is offering free oil changes for staff they just need to

- RCMP Careers presentation took place last week. All Grade 9 students attended this information session regarding potential career opportunities.
