Principal's Report

October 22, 2025

✓ Staffing Updates

- 1. We had two positions to offer this year. These vacancies were filled with Autumn Downey (D teacher, 1st year teaching) and Anna Galipeau (C teacher, 1st year but in second semester of teaching experience).
- 2. Jay Doherty is absent due to serious illness. We have replaced him by the following: hired a C contract teacher who is also doing his student teaching for 0.5 of the 1.0 contract. This is Zachary Sprague. The remaining time is being filled by retired teacher Cynthia Crowhurst as well as two other supply teachers weekly.
- 3. Addition of a Behaviour Intervention Mentor (BIM). This is a new role for the district and particularly high schools. Alicia Woodroffe is our BIM. She is my direct report.

√ Facilities Updates

- Lentil Upgrades to C/D wing: This project replaced the lentils and brick work above the windows on the exterior of D wing, but C wing also had the inside windows near library done. Unsure if the remaining windows on D wing will be done next summer.
- Work project for the drains in the boys changing room, under the ramp to gym and into the cafeteria was suspended this summer due to the scope of work.
- Tender for school custodial contract should be awarded at the end of this month. There were three contractors that viewed the school. Additions were made to the contract including the addition of one more custodian.

✓ School Financial Updates:

- Donations: 1 new donor/donation this year. I've been told it is approximately 20,000.00 and earmarked for the theatre renovation fund.
- AEI: We have no students this year and our existing money will need to be spent more frugal.
- Provincial Budget: These are monies that the school is given each
 year based on student ratios. This budget is spent on educational
 materials and school supplies for teachers and administration. It has
 several categories and we are generally fully spent by April annualy.
- O Special Projects: Each year for the last four years, EECD has earmarked funds to improve spending allotments for student fees and or materials needed to improve student access to learning. Skilled trades have also received improvements the last thee years. We currently have a pot of money to spend by early December which was recently given to skilled trades. This time we were given just over \$ 8000.00 dollars.
